Licensing & Permitting

These are suggested steps along with a listing and brief description of each of the forms and filings necessary for business operations in Greater Evansville, Indiana.

STEP ONE: Obtain Federal Tax ID and State Registration

FEDERAL TAX ID NUMBER

Almost everyone doing business is required to obtain a federal tax ID number, sometimes referred to as the Employer Identification Number (EIN). Application for this number can be done by completing the federal form SS-4 found at <http://www.irs.gov/pub/irs-pdf/fss4.pdf>.

STATE OF INDIANA REGISTRATION

You may also need to register with the State if you will be collecting sales tax, have employees, or be subject to other less common taxes. A list of these can be found at <http://www.in.gov/dor/3744.htm>.

Many times the retail merchant's certificate (RMC) is referred to as a business license. If you are subject to sales tax collection, you will receive this retail merchant's certificate after you complete Form BT-1 at <https://secure.in.gov/apps/dor/bt1/>. Form BT-1 is used to register the various other taxes referred to above.

STEP TWO: Obtain a Business License

CITY OF EVANSVILLE:

The city of Evansville, IN does not require a license to start a business. However, you may need a permit to change a sign or alter a building located in the downtown area. See step 7 for more information.

VANDEBURGH COUNTY:

Vanderburgh County, IN does not require a license to start a business.

STATE OF INDIANA:

State of Indiana has over 400 different licenses, permits, certifications, and other permissions, which could be required to engage in certain activities. The most commonly requested approvals are listed below. **This is not intended to be a complete listing**, nor should the omission of any license imply that it is not required.

Alcoholic beverages

Any individual or business serving, selling, or manufacturing beer, wine, or liquor for consumption will need to contact the Alcohol Tobacco Commission to obtain a permit or license. For more detailed information contact:

- **Retail Foods**

Businesses such as bed and breakfasts, food vending operations, restaurants, and grocery stores will need to contact Division of Retail Foods for state responsibilities and requirements which the business owner must comply. This may include being inspected and regulated by the county health department instead of the state.

- **Wholesale Foods**

Manufacturers, processors, repackers, or wholesale distributors of all non-dairy products statewide are regulated by Division of Wholesale Foods. Manufacturers or wholesale distributors will need to contact this division for state requirements and compliance responsibilities.

Contractor Services

The term "contractor" can be very confusing, as it is used in many business settings. An *independent contractor* can be anyone in business for him or herself who is offering services to others on a non-employee basis. The title of "contractor" is most commonly used to refer to those involved in construction or renovation of structures. It may be used to refer to *general contractors*, HVAC contractors, electrical contractors, or plumbing contractors. The only construction contractors licensed by the State of Indiana are plumbers. Many of the other specific areas require local licensing which vary by city and county.

Day care centers and day care in homes

"Day Nursery" means any institution operated for the purpose of providing care and maintenance to children separated from their parent, guardian or custodian during a part of the day for two or more consecutive weeks, except a school/other bona fide education institution. For information, contact:

Financial services

Businesses providing financial services may be covered by one or more of the areas described below. Keep in mind that a business offering financing or assisting the customer in finding financing for the purchase of its products may fall under one of the areas listed.

- **Consumer Related Financial Services**

The activities listed below, with their definitions, are regulated by the Indiana Department of Financial Institutions (IDFI). For questions regarding any of these consumers related financial services, contact:

- **Securities, Investments, Collections, and Brokering**

Loan Brokers (and Mortgage Brokers): A loan broker is defined as any person who, in return for any consideration from anyone, promises to procure a loan for any person or assist any person in procuring a loan from any third party, or who promises to consider whether or not to make a loan to any person. Unless he qualifies for any exemption from the loan broker statute, any person who collects up-front fees with the promise of making a loan or procuring a loan is a loan broker and must register with the Securities Division.

Other Regulated Areas: The Securities Division of Indiana Secretary of State's office regulates and oversees the securities industry in the State of Indiana. In addition the Securities Division also has regulatory authority over several other occupations and business activities not related to the securities industry. Other occupations or business activities regulated by the Securities Division are collection agencies, investment advisers, and broker-dealers and their agents. For more information, contact:

Transportation and registration of motor carriers

- **Operating Authority**

Motor carrier "operating authority" is generally required for any intrastate carrier transporting commodities or passengers for hire. Carriers involved in intrastate transportation of passengers and household goods (i.e. delivery service) must submit an application along with proof of insurance and other attachments to the Indiana Department of Revenue for authority to do so. Some examples of passenger carriers who would qualify are special and charter buses, limousine services, and non-emergency transportation of passengers to and from doctors' offices, nursing homes, and hospitals.

Carriers who are involved in intrastate transportation of regulated property are required to register with Department of Revenue for certification to operate between points within Indiana. An application and proof of insurance are also required to obtain this certification. Carriers who are involved in interstate transportation and are based in the state of Indiana are required to register their Interstate Commerce Commission (ICC) authority with the Indiana Department of Revenue. An application along with proof of insurance must be provided. For more information, call the Department of Revenue 317-615-7200.

- **Oversize/Overweight Vehicles**

Any vehicle or combination of vehicles that exceed the legal size or weight limits must first obtain a permit from the Indiana Department of Revenue before traveling on Indiana roads. Generally, the maximum width is 8 feet 6 inches, the maximum height is 13 feet 6 inches, and the maximum length is 40 feet for a single vehicle and 60 feet for a combination of vehicles. The maximum weight is 80,000 pounds, subject to specific axles and wheel limitations. Details on the permitting of oversize or overweight vehicles are available from the Indiana Department of Revenue by calling 317-615-7200.

- **Motor Carrier Fuel Taxes**

Commercial motor vehicles (or combination of vehicles) that have two axles and a gross vehicle weight in excess of 26,000 pounds, or that have three or more axles are required to register in order to comply with fuel tax laws. For more information, contact the Department of Revenue at 317-615-7200.

Interstate carriers will either file their liabilities under the International Fuel Tax Agreement through their base state, or will be required to obtain a trip permit from the Indiana Department of Revenue before traveling through the state.

Intrastate carriers need to register with the Indiana Department of Revenue before traveling through the state.

- **International Registration Plan**

Motor carriers must have properly registered license plates. If the carrier is based in Indiana, and engages in interstate travels, the plates will be apportioned under the International Registration Plan. The Department of Revenue administers this plan for Indiana carriers and issues the proper credentials. Contact the Department of Revenue at 317-615-7200 for more information.

Intrastate carriers who never leave the state of Indiana must visit a branch of the Indiana Bureau of Motor Vehicles for proper license plates. Contact the Bureau of Motor Vehicles or the State Information Center for locations of these branches.

- **Specifically Regulated Professions**

The Professional Licensing Agency has responsibility for the boards/commissions and their corresponding licenses or certifications, and is responsible for licensing most of the traditional health related occupations. STEP THREE: Obtain Permits / Licensing

Depending on what type of business you are running, determines which department is needed to obtain the local permits. The Building Commission requires permits for projects relating to the construction, alteration, and additions to buildings. Categories of permitting include building, energy, swimming pools, signs, electrical, plumbing, fuel gas, mechanical, fire suppression, demolitions, and fire alarms. The Building Commission maintains permitting applications, activity records, and report permitting statistics. The Building Commission issues Certificates of Occupancy and Certificates of Inspection upon project completion.

County Licensing-Contractors

The Building Commission issues trade licenses and registrations for electrical, plumbing, HVAC, sheet metal, steamfitter, and refrigeration trades. It also issues general contractor licenses and subcontractor licenses for commercial and residential building and alterations. The Building Commission issues specialty contractor licenses for building wrecking, building moving, manufactured home installation and alteration, sign erection, swimming pool installation, fire suppression, and fire alarm businesses and crafts. The Building Commission assists examination boards and the License and Disciplinary Board in the administration of approving license applicants and regulating the various license programs. The Building Commission maintains records of the licensing boards, license applicants and license holders including contractor continuing education. The Building Commission maintains records of required contractor bonds, certificates of liability insurance, and certificates of workman's compensation insurance. The department assists in filing claims against contractor bonds and insurance.

The Construction Site and Post Construction Runoff Control Ordinance [Evansville Municipal Code 16.2 } requires that post construction best management practices be installed in order to remove the pollutants from the storm water runoff prior to leaving the

site after the construction is complete. The City Engineer's Office and Storm Water Management Program provide guidance and assistance to facilitate compliance. Use of alternative, "green" options is encouraged.

EXPEDITED PERMITTING PROCESS:

The Area Planning Commission has established a permitting process that will quickly process applications and could provide approval of required permits within 5 days of application. Plans submitted to the Commission on Wednesdays by Noon will be reviewed the following Monday morning at 9:30 a.m. at a Site Review Meeting. If approved, permits may be issued that day. (Note: Erosion control plans are required to be submitted to the City or County Engineers office 2 weeks prior to an application being taken to a Site Review Meeting. Site Review approval, if given, is good for 6 months.) State Design Release is required to receive building permits. State Design Release can take 15 business days or more to receive.

STEP FOUR: Other License / Permits

In addition to the city and county licenses/permits, certain businesses or occupations are required to obtain special licenses or permits. **The list below is not intended to be a complete listing**, nor should the omission of any license imply that it is not required. Evansville EPA - Municipal Certificate of Operation Permit

The Evansville Municipal Code (EMC) 16.05.270 requires businesses or manufacturers in the jurisdiction of the EEPA (the City of Evansville and four miles beyond City limits, but not outside Vanderburgh County) to obtain a Municipal Certificate of Operation (permit) from the EEPA, if that business or manufacturer has constructed, installed, modified, or operates any stationary or portable process equipment, which has potential emissions of any regulated air pollutant, exhausting to the outside air. The requirement to obtain a permit pertains to any manufacturing or fabricating activity that produces particles or fumes.

These operating permits reference federal, state and municipal regulations and outline specific requirements applicable to the permitted business or industry. These permits

limit the airborne emissions the businesses are allowed to discharge to the atmosphere, thereby protecting air quality, public health and the environment. Facilities permitted by the EEPA are required to report emissions on a yearly basis and most are inspected at least annually.

Examples of facilities that require a Municipal Certificate of Operation are:

STATE TAXES

Return completed application and materials with 3 hard copies (no larger than 11x17) or one electronic version to the Growth Alliance for Greater Evansville. The Design Review Committee meets the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of the month and either **recommends** approval or denial to the Redevelopment Commission. The Applicant is required to attend the Design Review Committee meeting. **Deadline to submit an application and supporting materials is 1 week prior to meeting.** Application is available at no cost to the applicant.

After recommendation from the Design Review Committee, the application goes before the Executive Redevelopment Commission (generally meets the first and third Tuesdays of each month.) If approved, the applicant is to visit the Building Commission to obtain necessary permits.
